Weekly Review

Please note, the Weekly Review does not include all calls to which the Lakeville Police Department responded. Incidents included here are based on severity, impact on public safety or other factors.

- Officers responded to 17XXX Kenwood Trail after an attempted fraud that transformed into a theft. The suspect made a mobile order, swiped a declined card in the store, then walked out with the food. Patrol is following up.
- A vehicle was stopped for lane use, and the driver was found to have a warrant for arrest. The driver was jailed on the warrant and cited for driving after revocation.
- Officers responded to a two-vehicle crash at 162nd St W and Kenwood Trail where the at-fault driver drove through a red light and collided with another vehicle. The at-fault driver was cited for a semaphore violation.
- Officers responded to a two-vehicle crash at I-35 and County Rd 46. The at-fault driver was cited for a host of violations including driving after revocation, failing to obey a traffic control device and failure to yield.
- Officers responded to a fraud report after a victim was contacted by someone claiming to represent her TV service provider. The caller directed her to purchase \$1,000 in gift cards, read the card numbers over the phone, and grant remote access to her computer. This incident serves as a reminder to remain cautious of unsolicited contacts and common scam tactics.
- A victim reported sending \$400 in cryptocurrency to a scammer who contacted them through Discord while posing as a scam protection service. The victim also provided their driver's license and credit card information. This serves as a reminder to never share personal or financial information with unknown or unverified parties.
- Officers were dispatched to a parking lot after reports to a slumper behind the wheel. Upon arrival, officers made contact with the driver and identified him. The driver showed obvious signs of impairment and was placed through the standard field sobriety testing. The driver provided a DMT sample of 0.22g/210L and was charged with DUI and transported to Dakota County Jail.
- Officers completed a traffic accident report for a rear-end accident at Pilot Knob Rd and 160th St. The at-fault driver was cited for following too closely.
- A traffic stop was conducted for expired tabs, and the driver was identified and found to have an active warrant for arrest. The driver was arrested without incident and booked into Dakota County Jail.
- Officers responded to a two-vehicle crash at Highview Ave and 165th St W. The at-fault driver failed to stop for the stop sign and struck another vehicle in the middle of the intersection. Luckily, no injuries were sustained and the at-fault driver was cited accordingly.
